

We are currently trialling the use of video tutorials in the MFL

department to support language learning both within and



classroom; consolidate their learning through watching the video after the relevant lesson; and expand their knowledge by browsing future lessons. Importantly, students can watch the videos as often and as many times as they choose, thus allowing young people to work at a pace which is optimised for their individual learning styles. With the 'lecture' part of each lesson accessible on-line by students out of school time, the classroom is freed up as a place for experimentation and manipulation of

skills and knowledge. As well as accessing video tutorials on-line in their own time, students are also increasingly using the videos during class time. In the Art department this practice is already well-established and in Japanese, small groups are able to work with the teacher during class time, whilst others are accessing the on-line learning tools. Although in its early days, the response from the students has been

most encouraging, and we are rolling out training to enable video tutorials to be produced in all faculty areas in the future.

The IBDP graduates were the first to receive their results and there were many notable successes with nineteen students achieving 40 points or more: this result places those students in the top 5% worldwide. Our students secured



this year was Edinburgh with eight starting in September. Other popular universities are as follows: Bristol (5 students), Cambridge (4), Cardiff (5), City (2), Durham (5), Exeter (4), Glasgow (3), Hague (3), King's College London (3), Lancaster (3), Leicester (2), McGill (2), Nottingham (5), Oxford (4), St Andrews (2), University College London UCL (2), UEA (2) and Warwick (3). The list is a long and prestigious one and we are extremely proud of our Diploma graduates. In August, the long wait for GCSE results was over and the hard work our students and staff had put in was finally rewarded with


