Think about a list of endangered animals ... Did your list include rhinos, elephants, gorillas, turtles, and tigers? All these animals are critically endangered. However, did you know that over 2000 UK species are registered on the IUCN Red list of threatened species? Threatened species in the UK include:

1. Hedgehogs: The number of hedgehogs has fallen by 50% since the year 2000. 2. Small tortoiseshell butterfly: In 2013 it was reported that the number of these butterflies decreased by 77% in the previous 10 years.



Turtle dove: The turtle dove population decreased by 97% since 1970. Puffins: listed as vulnerable on the IUCN Red list.

- 3. Create safe habitats for animals, for example, build a hedgehog home, and make a bug hotel. 4. Put out shallow bowls of water during very hot spells.
- 6. Create hedgehog highways by constructing small gaps in garden fences. 7. Create a small wildlife pond.
- 8. Support local nature and wildlife charities through membership or donations. Helping nature is not only good for animals and the environment but it's good for us too with evidence






