### School Diversity Week and Express Your Identity (Non-Uniform) Day

The week commencing 20th June is School Diversity Week. While this week is inspired by June's status as Pride Month, we want to celebrate all aspects of our students' diversity. Students will have the opportunity to be involved in a variety of ways, including:

- form activities each morning
- PSHE lessons with a focus on diversity
- special dishes served in the Refectory from around the world
- a diversity fair in the Cloister Garden on Wednesday at break and lunchtime
- a unique non-uniform day on Friday 24th June called "Express Your Identity Day"

On Express Your Identity Day (Friday 24th June), students are encouraged to come to school wearing something that represents an aspect of their identity that is important to them; be it their ethnicity, nationality, gender identity, sexual orientation, ability, neurodivergence or any other part of who they are that is to be cherished and celebrated.

Students are permitted to wear items of clothing which are appropriate for school including:

- Traditional or cultural dress, or any clothes students feel represent an important aspect of their identity
- Non-uniform shirts/t-shirts, ties, badges and stickers and make-up that fits within the College policy. Small items of jewellery e.g. stud earrings and simple necklaces/bracelets may be worn. Please note that nails should remain unpainted on this day.

Unlike non-uniform days students are not expected to pay on the day, but for those who wish to make a donation to the schools Diversity Club's chosen charity MindOut | Mental Health Charity for LGBTQ community there will be an opportunity to do so when entering the Refectory at lunchtime.



I hope our students will support these events and join us in celebrating the wonderful diversity at Hockerill.

## **East Herts Black Parents Assembly**

The East Herts Black Parents Assembly (BPA) is a grassroots organisation set up by local parents (including Hockerill parents), to build community, improve opportunities and enrich the lives of Black and biracial families. - All books for normal lessons (Periods 1-5) must also be bought to College in case the event is cancelled due to poor weather
- Please ensure that your child is prepared for the weather with water and sun cream if necessary




