- We can only accept requests to attend the trip from Weekly and Flexi Boarders once we have received confirmation from your child's Head
- of House that they will be staying for the required nights Please see the Weekend programme of activities/trips here. This will allow you to discuss with your child any trips they may wish to go on.
- A reminder that in early September an email was sent to all parents of Full Boarders with an opportunity to opt out of any Boarding weekend trip on behalf of their child


that the dress code is suits or formal dress. This event will start at 18.45 and finish at 22.00.

a few hours and continued to hike to their base the following day.




