Industrial Action March 15th and 16th

The next round of industrial action by the teaching union NEU is planned for Wednesday March 15th and Thursday March 16th. The College has been closed to all students for the previous days of strikes but this time due to planned internal exams we will be open for some year groups.

Years 10 to 13

The College will be open to all students in these year groups on March 15th and 16th with students following their normal timetable as much as possible. It is inevitable that there will be some lessons where teachers are not present as they are taking industrial action. In those lessons we will adopt a 'study hall' approach and classes without a teacher will be gathered together in the Refectory and supervised while they

Reminder: Campus Security Upgrades and Dunmow Road car park

Road or Stansted Road. If you need to drop-off and pick-up close to the school, this must therefore be in the Dunmow Road car park. The only

This table indicates the GCSE subjects that are affected and the timeline of the appeals


