The DfE have now informed us that students should continue to test themselves during the Easter holidays. Testing should be carried out once every five days. Students must ensure they have one test available to use just before their return to College on Sunday 11th April (residential boarders) or Monday 12th April (all other students).

The NHS has published the following related to positive cases: Positive result received at home: If a child in year 7 and above receives a positive Lateral Flow Device test result from a test taken at home

(at home includes a boarding house), they must book a PCR test to confirm the result even if they have no symptoms.

The positive Lateral Flow Device test triggers the legal obligation for self-isolation for them and close contacts including household members. You cannot attend school or a work setting if you have received If the PCR test comes back with a negative result, the period of self-isolation ends for them and all close contacts including household


