The College has experience of using two main providers; Collinson at Stansted Airport provide onsite testing and our experience is that they have been very efficient, although this involves taxi transportation (with its associated costs) to and from the airport (and supervision by an adult if they are under 16 years old).

Alternatively, <u>DNA Workplace</u> offer postal tests, and the College Nurses are trained and authorised to administer their tests. However, it should be noted that we have experienced occasional delays with this service, due to the post. If you opt for a postal test, please can you ensure that the test is posted to your child (addressed to them at their boarding house), it will be their responsibility to bring the test to the Health Centre

Please also be aware that the College Nurses are only certificated to administer to administer tests from DNA Workplace, some other providers require trained professionals to administer their own tests, but College nurses will not be authorised to administer these, therefore parents must ensure that the specific requirements of any tests they order fits the criteria to allow them to fly.

Parents are welcome to use other companies, the above are not recommendations, purely providers that we have some experience with.


