## >GENERAL NOTICES

#### Covid-19 reminder

Sadly, case rates are continuing to increase in the UK. While hospitalisations are lower than at the peak of the virus, we are still seeing people becoming very ill with Covid-19 and those yet to be vaccinated, namely under 18's who are at the greatest risk of infection.

In line with Government and Public Health guidance, we provide rapid tests (also known as tests using Lateral Flow Devices/LFTs) for your child to take at home and/or complete at school and, if taken regularly, these can help reduce the risk of us spreading Covid-19 to one another and keep children in school.

Our staff are also taking regular tests and we're encouraging all parents and carers to do the same, order online, collect from a pharmacy or visit a mobile testing site, view your options at: <a href="https://www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/rapidtest">www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/rapidtest</a>. Please do not test children below year 7, these tests are not recommended or made for use on younger children.

If you test positive using a rapid test you must book a confirmatory PCR test at: www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test. Your whole household, including any children, must begin self-isolating immediately.

These are challenging times for us all, please do not send children in if:

- They have any symptoms of Covid-19 (a new, continuous cough, change or loss of taste or smell, a temperature) in this instance you must book a PCR test
- They are generally unwell, especially with colds, headache and runny noses it is better to be safe than sorry
- They have been identified as a close contact and/or asked to self-isolate

#### Earthquake in Geography classroom!

To conclude the 'Restless Earth' unit of work this week the Year 9 bilingual students created their own earthquake proof buildings to demonstrate their knowledge of cross bracing and how to effectively redistribute seismic waves during an earthquake.

They had to ensure the structures were a minimum of 36 cm high and needed to have at least 2 levels, which could support up to 12 x 25 g bean bags. The earthquake was then reconstructed with Mrs Mackenzie's

earthquake wobble board. Some buildings were more robust than others! The Year 9 Geographers who have chosen to continue the subject at GCSE next year will all be made members of their Year 10 class team


