The school year 2021/22 is up and running with all students back on campus. It is great to have the 'busyness' and activity of all our students back with us as it is the first time all of Year 7 to 13 have been on-site since March. This week began with two training days for all College staff with sessions focussing on the College Strategic Plan (see below for more details), International Baccalaureate and OFSTED accreditation and training on safeguarding, mental health and IT. Various improvement projects to College facilities were also completed ready for the students. These included decorating and new carpets in boarding houses, fencing

along the public footpath and upgrading IT equipment in classrooms. This week we have also completed the first of two mandatory 'back-to-school' LFD tests with students (the second is on Monday) and this has helped to ensure that we start the year safely and healthily. After Monday, LFD tests should be taken twice weekly at home and your child will have brought home test kits that will enable you to do this. Thank you in advance for your help and support with this crucial element in our protection control.


> NEWS FROM THE GOVERNING BOARD

Nelson Mandela (Red)

Each logo was carefully designed to place each person in a location important to them. Bader Ginsburg's has her placed on the magnificent staircase of the US Supreme Court where she was a justice from 1993 until her death in 2020.

Nelson Mandela made his first speech after his release from prison from the City Hall in Cape Town in 1990. The logo shows Cape Town and Table Mountain as seen from Robben Island, where Mandela was imprisoned in 1964.

Seacole's logo is based on contemporary sketches of the British Hotel in the Crimea that Mary Seacole ran during the Crimean War.

Alan Turing's Bombe, the machine that decoded Enigma, takes centre stage in Turing's logo, complete with the coloured bands that encircled each drum.

Although Years 7-10 will be in mixed Equipe forms, the Equipes will still be an important aspect of their lives at Hockerill and they will continue to participate in Equipe competitions and attend regular Equipe assemblies.

The Heads of Equipe and I look forward to working together to move the Equipes forward this year.




Student Photographs

Student's individual photographs will be taken on Monday 6th September. Each student will be given a Unique Photo Ticket with a QR code which they will bring home for you to scan and view online.


New Parents' Morning and Evening Social Hello and a very warm welcome (back) to Hockerill after what was hopefully a wonderful summer break.
