### Postponement of HPV Immunisations for Year 8 students

You will be aware that the NHS Immunisations Team came into College on 11th October to vaccinate students in the 12-15 yrs age group. Due to the large number of students absent on the 11th, the Immunisations Team plan to return to the College to catch those students who were not in school on the day of their visit. We have yet to be advised when this visit will take place. Any parent eager to have their child (aged 12 or over) vaccinated without waiting for the catch-up school session, may make an appointment to take their child to be vaccinated at their local Vaccination Hub by visiting www.nhs.uk/covid-vaccination

This year Diwali takes place over five days from 2nd to 6th November with the main day of celebration on Thursday 4th November.

Diwali is the five-day Festival of Lights, celebrated by millions of Hindus, Sikhs and Jains across the world. For some this also coincides with harvest and new year celebrations and is a festival of new beginnings and the triumph of good over evil and light over darkness. Each religion marks different historical events and stories:

Hindus celebrate the return of deities Rama and Sita to Ayodhya after

their 14-year exile. They also celebrate the day Mother Goddess Durga destroyed a demon called Mahisha. Sikhs particularly celebrate the release from prison of the sixth guru

Hargobind Singh in 1619. But Sikhs celebrated the festival before this date. In fact, the foundation stone of the Golden Temple at Amritsar, the most holy place in the Sikh world, was laid on Diwali in 1577.

The founder of Jainism is Lord Mahavira. During Diwali, Jains celebrate the moment he reached a state called Moksha (nirvana, or eternal bliss).
